**UNACCOMPANIED
& SEPARATED
CHILDREN**

These children are at heightened risk of **exploitation, abuse and other rights violations**. They are also more prone to suffer from depression and anxiety.



**WAR
WOUNDED**

Many **do not get the urgent treatment** they need. Untreated injuries can lead to permanent disabilities.

Funding for complex trauma cases is **diminishing**.

RISING POVERTY LEVELS

Most **Palestine refugees from Syria** live in **abject poverty** and have a **precarious legal status**.

93% of Syrian refugees outside camps live below the poverty line.

Rent accounts for over half of Syrian refugees' monthly expenditures.

This impacts **human rights** related to education, birth registration, nationality, legal identity and freedom of movement.
